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It is an offence to cause a nuisance, disturbance, act in a threatening way or make threats on school grounds under section 547 of the Education Act.

Following section 547 of the Education Act (1996) if anyone acts in a threatening, violent or intimidating way then their licence to enter will be modified.

Types of behaviour that are considered serious and unacceptable and will not be tolerated:

- shouting at members of the school staff, parents or children either in person or over the telephone;
- physically intimidating a member of staff, parent or child eg standing very close to her/him;
- the use of aggressive hand gestures;
- threatening behaviour;
- shaking or holding a fist towards another person;
- swearing;
- using abusive/ offensive language
- pushing;
- hitting, e.g. slapping, punching and kicking;
- spitting;
- racist, sexist, homophobic or transgender comments;
- breaching the school's security procedures.

During a suspended license you will need to arrange for your child to be brought to school and collected by someone else. If this license suspension is breached then a criminal and civil offence will have been committed, a full revocation of your license to enter will be pursued (a full ban) and information will be sent to the police and school lawyers.
