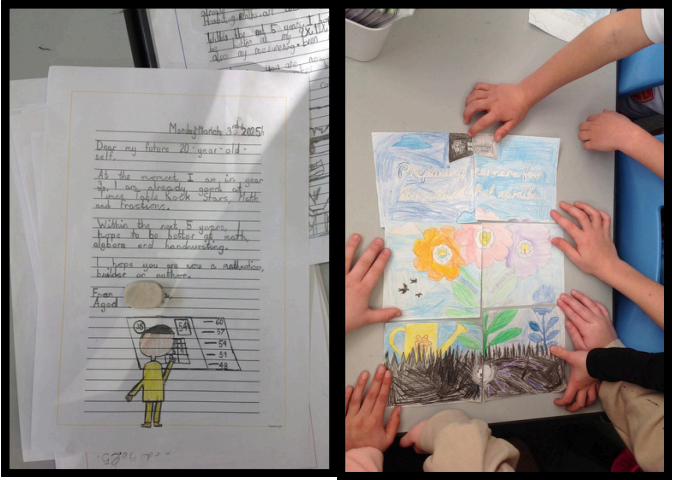

This half term, I've enjoyed our peer review process. School leaders visit each other's schools, working together to spot what's going well and what could be better. A senior leader then helps staff create a clear plan to make improvements. It's a team effort that keeps our schools improving and improving for our children.



We're also thrilled with our provisional new intake numbers for September, which show how well our schools' reputations are growing. We only have a few spaces left at each school, so families should apply soon to secure a place. Additionally, our preschools at North Crescent and Rayleigh are fantastic options for children starting the term after they turn two years old. Both schools have an Ofsted-rated Outstanding Early Years provision, providing an excellent start for our youngest learners.
