A message from Dr. Faris



On a recent night out (yes, Headteachers and CEOs do occasionally have those!) I saw a poster for the "Ask for Angela" campaign, a simple but powerful idea that helps people discreetly seek help if they feel unsafe. It made me stop and think...

As a Trust, we serve hundreds of families, and the reality is stark: around 1 in 4 women and 1 in 6 men in the UK will experience domestic abuse in their lifetime. That means some of the people reading this now, or people you know will be living with something no one should ever have to face.

Our values are about being pioneering, altruistic and ethical, and those values don't just shape how we teach and lead, they guide how we care for the families we serve too. That means standing beside people in their hardest moments and making sure support is never out of reach.

I hate that I even have to write these words, but I want you to know this. No one should ever suffer in silence. If you ever need help, you can call the school office, send us an email, ask a staff member or simply pop in and ask for "Mrs Angela." You won't be questioned on the spot and we will do everything we can to create a safe space for you and help you access the support you need

Sometimes, the hardest step is reaching out but please know we're here, and you're not alone.
