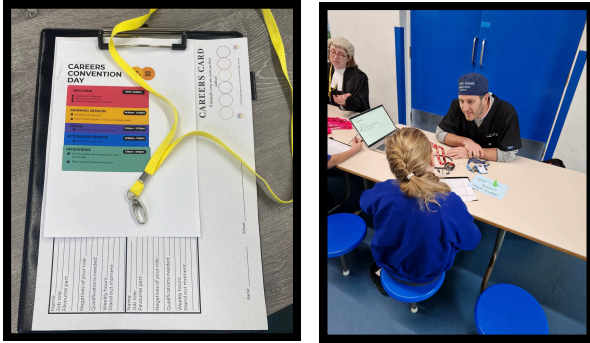


## CEO REFLECTIONS

## PRO-SOCIAL REWARDS

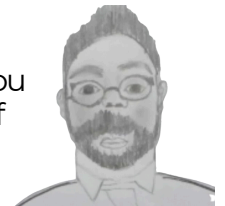
The children at Rayleigh Primary in Year 3 and 4 received their award for their snow leopard adoption.
